## **Music News**

Happy new year! It's January and for our music program, that means two things: recorder karate and the beginning of our extracurricular programs!

Recorder Karate - Grades 4-6

For our grade 4-6 students, our music classes will be focused on recorder until the February break. Students are welcome to bring their own recorder from home, or they may borrow a school recorder for the duration of the unit. If your child would like to have their own recorder, we recommend purchasing the Yamaha brand **Baroque** soprano recorder at Long & McQuade, which is priced at \$8.99, over cheaper models that may not sound or play as well. Students are expected to send 5-10 minutes per day practicing their recorder at home and can earn colored "belts" for their recorder!

### Extracurricular Opportunities

We will be offering three types of lunchtime extracurricular activities this year:

- Two choirs, for grades 2-3 (with Ms. Norris) and grades 4-6 (with Ms. Shea)
- "Ready-to-rock" rock band for musicians who already have experience playing guitar, drums, bass, piano, or vocals. Students who auditioned will meet with Ms. Shea early in January to get started!
- Beginner clubs for: piano, guitar, and drums

   these will be open to all students in grade
   4-6. Interested students can come to learn
   the basics and practice independently, with
   coaching from Ms. Shea (and other
   helpers!). Our extracurricular schedule is still
   being finalized but these beginner clubs will
   likely take place one at a time in six-week
   sessions, so students can choose to join the
   club for one instrument or all of them!
