Walking to School

Tips: use sidewalks and cross at crosswalks or intersections, but if there is no sidewalk, walk facing oncoming traffic.



Afternoon pick up

Students who take the bus are dismissed at 2:35. For safety reasons, please do not walk through the bus area. **Parents who are picking up their child(ren) need to wait by the large tree outside the kindergarten doors or on the sidewalk by the street.** The sidewalk by the school is too congested with adults waiting and it is not safe for students. The bell rings for walkers/pick-ups at 2:40. Please share this information with the adults who are picking up your child/children.

Students who are picked up **MUST** be picked up at **2:40**. There is no supervision for students past 2:40.

Staying Home When Sick

Staying home when you are sick lowers the chance of spreading illnesses to students and staff in the school.

Warm Clothes

Students are reminded to wear warmer outdoor clothing, jackets, hats, mittens or gloves, and boots now that the days are becoming colder. All students are outside twice a day for outdoor recreation at recess time. This time is much more enjoyable when students are dressed for colder temperatures. **Please remember to label all your child's outdoor clothing with their first and last name so items can be easily returned if they are misplaced.**


